New Business

1. Principal's Report - Jill Sunderman

3. Committee Reports

A. Fundraising - Beth McPeek

- Read-A-Thon Results and Successes
 - 23 winners got Blue Manatee gift cards
 - Pajama Day was fun for classes with over 80% reading participation
 - Exceeded goal of \$16,500 fundraised

- Under budget on expenses
- · Great community event: thanks to all of the volunteers!
- Literature this year was different from last; we wanted to stress the importance of reading and not just focus on earning money pledges.
- Author visit was awesome; the popular L.A. author was thrilled by the HPS audience and said HPS students were extremely creative and respectful
- · Small holiday capsule sale for spirit wear is coming up
- 11/29 Restaurant Night at Pizzeria Locale; 50% of sales go to HPS

B. Financial Update- Jessica Lund & Emily Danner

- Achieved our goal for the Read-a-Thon; 30% of our budget comes from this fundraiser, so we are pleased with the success
- Mad Tree event exceeded fundraising goal
- Socials continue to be strong, almost \$3,500 so far this year
 - Pumpkin Chuck is this Saturday, November 4 (10am-noon)
 - 4th-Grade Family Carnival is also Saturday, November 4
 - Family Swim Party in January still spots available for the 3-5pm time slot; \$8 a person/ \$32 max for the family
- \$9,400 spent on field trips so far this year (Camp Ernst, Camp Joy, theatre for Kindergarteners, deposit for the zoo; Gorman Farm, among others)
- \$2,500 spent on Special teacher supplies
- \$1,000 towards classroom needs (listening center, new classroom set-up)
- · Book fair profits are being used to buy books off teachers' wish lists
- Taxes have been filed

C. LSDMC - Pete Riddle

- Marisa has been diligently assessing the gym, looking at schools of similar age/size to see how our school fares in comparison; looking at construction of expanded cafeteria, too
- · Permanent principal search is underway

D. Hyde Park School Community Update- Marisa Rowe

- · Campaign will end in December; thank you for donating!
- 63% of the goal has been fundraised, so the First Phase of the project is a go; the First Phase includes removing the old asphalt and trees, planting new trees, adding a rubberized surface under a new play set. The Second Phase includes adding outside classrooms and stepping stones. We need 77% of the fundraising goal to complete Phase Two. The Third Phase includes the outdoor court (an all-sports surface for volleyball, soccer, etc).

- Fundraising is not over; the play yard committee is currently reaching out to HPS families and the neighborhood families, still meeting with foundations, working with business leaders and neighborhood leaders
- The HPS Foundation will match donations up to a total of \$50,000; Nov 14 is the last day of the match event share
- · Madtree social event on November 14 to celebrate the play yard; it's free; RSVP
- Pumpkin Chuck the catapult is built; there will be games, popcorn, free Starbucks; a \$5 suggested donation will allow each child to launch their pumpkin
