3. Review of 2017-18 Budget (Jessica Lund)

- A. Children do not do direct sales (merchandise, etc.); money is raised in other ways
- B. Revenue (\$64,250)
 - Spring Celebration is our biggest source of revenue. 50% of the budget comes from this event. 30K is the goal. Additional fundraising sources are actively being pursued to lessen the pressure on this event.
 - Raffle baskets: every dollar received goes directly back to the teachers; they receive a check in May.
 - Read-a-Thon: great opportunity to raise money and get kids excited about reading (rally, prizes, etc.).
 - Spirit Wear goal of \$750; we did \$200 in pre-sales during Ice Cream Social
 - Socials: budgeted to earn \$4000
 - Box Tops: \$1200 is the goal; we made \$1000 last year
 - Shopping Cards (AmazonSmile, Rempke, Kroger Rewards) budgeted \$4000
 - Restaurant Nights: encourage our families to dine and informally gather, while also raising money
- C. Expenditures (\$60,150)
 - Field Day, End-of-Year Picnic, New Family Picnic, Moving-on Ceremony, Enrichment
 - Field Trips- K-5th grades are given \$2700 and 6th Grade is given \$3000 to spend on either a large field trip or multiple field trips (e.g. Kindergarten attends multiple plays at the Taft Theatre)

- Scholarships \$1000 for students who can't afford to pay the extracurricular fees or other opportunities
- SumDog subscriptions, Quickbooks fees, Constant Contact fees
- Printing and Copying 3 cents a copy; it is expensive to put paper in the Tuesday folders each week; this could be revisited to see how we can save on paper costs
- Specials Supply Fund 6K (\$1000 for each Specials classroom, plus Intervention Specialists)
- Teacher Appreciation \$2600 to pay for lunches during conferences, Teacher Appreciation Week events
- Classroom Setup \$4200 for new classroom setup materials, items for new teachers, supplies
- D. Net Positive: \$3850; net money will carry over to next year's PTO

- · Read-a-Thon second largest fundraiser; Book Fair coincides with it
- MadTree Event HPS PTO is the Charity of the Month; Sept. 12 is Split the Pot raffle there

- Kroger Community Rewards about \$1000 each quarter; easy way to fundraise
