7:00 Principal's Report – Jill Sunderman & Tiffani Wills

7:20 Committee Reports

- Financial Update Brandon Hunter & Andrew Farwig
 - New Account, COVID-19 relief fund; over \$3000 raised. It's going to families of HPS who need help during this time.
 - Spring Celebration: revenue is only down \$4800 from last year, which is a great showing considering the circumstances; not as much was raised in the Spring Celebration due to it taking place virtually.
- Fundraising Ed Paff & Ashley Tolokonsky
 - Spring Celebration: was a great success especially considering the virtual format; \$27K in sponsorships; \$11K in silent auction; up in Kroger Shopper funds raised compared to last year.
 - Socials and tickets are going to go on sale soon; they were not for sale in the auction due to not knowing when those events would take place; they will be put on sale in the future.
 - Restaurant Nights:
 - Marcos Restaurant night brought in \$121;
 - Dinners to Doorbells Week from May 13 to May 19; you can order on their website; use the code in the HPS Weekly email blast.
 - Spirit Wear
 - Last spirit wear sale brought in \$350; they gave us free shipping.
- Athletics Mike Brugh
 - All Spring Athletics are cancelled.
 - Trying to figure out refunds or credits from Spring sports, as well as Fall registration; some people may want to donate their Spring registration fees, or have them credited forward to a future season. The process of refunds or credits will be communicated as soon as possible.
 - Fall registration is tricky because we don't know what's happening with next school year, but plans are being made and will be communicated as soon as possible.

- School Board hasn't published a budget for next school year, so there has been on talk about the expansion of HPS.
- Thankfully the district responded to concerns about classes crossing the street to the bank and we are getting two modular for the 2020-2021 school year;
 - Both mods will have a bathroom; be equipped with fire safety equipment; have stairs and railings to enter; they will be placed in the parking lot close to the school building.
