- Financial Update – Brandon Hunter & Page Lee
 - Just received \$1556 from shopping card programs
 - Spent some \$ on items needed for the school reopening

- Volunteering – Ed Paff
 - Plexiglass/Acrylic Barriers:
 - Estimate of \$3000 to purchase them.
 - Still hoping to build them to save money;
 - Construction can possibly begin this weekend
 - Possible idea to construct the barriers in a way that they can be used at any shape of table
 - The barriers will allow students to resume class as normally possible so that students can participate in small group learning.
- Athletics – Mike Brugh
 - Refunds from Spring season that was canceled are still forthcoming;
 - The refs in SAY Soccer are praising the HPS parents for wearing masks and abiding by the COVID-19 rules.
 - Running club K-2 started this week; 3-6 begins next week.
 - Booster membership is paid annually; the funds contribute to uniforms and facilities.
 - Booster members get a Foam Finger!!
 - Foam Finger Friday—if you put your finger in your window on Friday and it's spotted, you'll be put in a drawing each week.

- Basketball for Grades 2-6 is coming—possible December or January start; but there will be a lot of stipulations to be able to participate. We typically rent a facility which costs a lot of money and will come with a lot of rules;
 - HPS Athletics just received another corporate sponsorship.
 - Every coach had to have a COVID kit with thermometers and other supplies; the sponsorship and booster funds pay for those as well.
 - Instructional Basketball for K-1 is usually at HPS, so K-1 basketball is still up in the air.

7:50 Principal's Report – Jill Sunderman

- When COVID just began we had over 580 students; about 50 students dropped.
- We have 531 students.
- The District opted for a 1-2-2 model; Monday is virtual for all students. Tuesday/Wednesday is in-person for Group A; Thursday/Friday is in-person for Group B.
- The District has prohibited streaming education while the A or B group is present in the school due to bandwidth of the district.
- Everyone will be wearing masks.
- HPS has purchased barriers for the smaller classrooms
- The District has purchased barriers for eating purposes
- Two stairwells are used to go up; two stairwells to go down.
- All staff and students will learn to walk on the right side of the hallways to maintain a distance even when passing in the hall.
- Visual dots will be in the hall so students can have guidance about social distancing.
- Specialists will be coming into the classrooms and Mr. Schwab will be outside
- Breakfast & Lunch will be in the classroom
- Recess will be outside and students will still wear masks

- There will be a mask free zone outside for any students who need a break
- Arrival & Dismissal:
 - Arrival: Doors open at 7:40: Walkers enter through Gym Lobby Door & Door 2 are for Bus riders through Door 4; Car riders through Door 1 and Cafeteria.
 - **The school day officially starts at 8 am.**
 - Dismissal: staggered.
 - Intervention specialists to walk students to busses; floor moderators to help students remain social distanced and to get where they need to go within the school
- HPS will have a nurse on site every day
- Isolation room next to nurse's room.
- Any student experiencing symptoms will go to the isolation room; student will be sent home if the student seems to have COVID
- If there's a case of COVID; district has protocol for what happens if there's a case of COVID.
- Our student safety officer is returning this year.
- The Crosswalk is zebra striped now.
- Parking lot is restriped now.

8:00 Questions / Comments

- Four staff members at each door and Grades 3-6 teachers are there to help K-2 students get to their classrooms the first week.
- There are extra masks at school
- HPS Staff wants to stream for various reasons, a primary reason being that if a student has to quarantine, they can keep up with instruction.
- A Specials Schedule is on a 5 Week Rotation; each Group has the Special on the days they are in school
- Soccer is one of the sports allowed to be played.

- For families not ready to send student back in person—District is trying to decide what to do—have them register for Cincinnati Digital Academy versus call in absent to HPS;
- The Board charged the superintendent with what to do in this situation—should they get a packet of work? Etc... If enough families say their students aren't coming in person to school, the school may have some leeway to have a remote classroom. The District is still figuring this out.
- Ms. Sunderman will be in contact with families who have these concerns so please reach out to her if you have concerns like those explained in the previous two bullet points.
- Walnut Hills testing: Sixth Graders will be testing most mornings they're at school for the first few weeks.
- HPS was able to purchase a double-sided portable sink that will arrive mid-October, which will help with students outside coming in to have lunch; this will speed up the process for kids to wash their hands before lunch.
- **CRC will be on site using playground and cafeteria on limited basis.**
