- **Financial Update** Brandon Hunter & Page Lee
  - Income :
    - Spiritwear : \$374.80
    - Restaurant Nights : Swenson's \$2000 ; Jason's Deli \$72.50 ; Chipotle \$415
  - We've been spending money to help the school reopen, with COVID expenditures (the barriers and picnic tables)
  - Tax Return for 2019 Fiscal year has been submitted
- Fundraising Ashley Tolokonsky
  - Restaurant Nights (Raising Cane's is coming up on Nov. 12)
  - Evereve is doing a Fashion event which is a fundraiser
  - **Read-a-Thon:** Ends this coming Monday Nov. 9;
    - Tomorrow (Nov. 5 is the last day for a drawing through submitting a pic on Padlet on Nov. 6)
    - A group will be in the parking lot and outdoor classroom collecting paper pledge sheets, cash, checks, and reading logs during morning drop off.

- The form is very simple (collects parents' names, zip codes, and when they'd be sending a child to Kindergarten at HPS)
- It's being posted in Facebook groups, Neighborhood Councils, etc.

# 8:00 Principal's Report – Jill Sunderman

- Everyone is doing really well with in-person instruction!
- 6 positive cases including students, staff, and visitors (including substitutes) but because of 6 feet of social distance and outdoor lunch etc the close contacts have been minimal.

- When there's a confirmed case, everyone receives a letter informing about the case and letting you know that you're not a close contact or a close contact.
- Less than 20 kids have been tested; turn around time for the tests is very fast.
- 529 students enrolled (only down 11 from last year)
- 26 kids signed an agreement to stay home and these students will hopefully be able to stream with their groups (A or B) as they continue their schooling at home.
- There are no changes to the outdoor playing rules; still not allowed to use balls, etc.
