- Financial Update Brandon Hunter & Page Lee
  - Budget Updates & Vote
  - Spring Celebration made : \$22K in Sponsorships ; almost %7K in auctioned items, for a total of approximately \$29K
    - Over 70 items in raffle and silent auction items, and those items brought in almost \$7,000

- Harmony Park is being completed and till add \$6K to the budget; 6th grade has donated \$1,000...the addition/completion of Harmony Park will occur this summer
- Increasing to \$5400 dollars for student gifts (instead of \$3500 for student tshirts)
- \$372 from Chipotle Restaurant Night
- Extracurriculars Dawn Wolfe
  - The directors of extracurricular clubs are ready to come back to HPS next year, and this will be lined up as soon as CPS gives guidance about allowing other adults in the building

• No recent COVID cases

- The outdoor space at school is being used very well
- Summer Scholars is being extended to all day by adding an afternoon enrichment piece (8 am to 2 pm)
- The afternoon enrichment will consist of offering some programming for social/emotional health and enrichment. There's also a potential program called Bell Excel (a STEAM program).
- Working to finalize plans for Field Day; it'll be done by grade level. Mr. Cassidy, Mr.
  Williams, Mike Brugh, and Principal Sunderman are in the process of making plans.
  Each grade level's experience will last about 1.5 hours.
- Language Survey: Spanish had the highest number of votes, followed by Latin.
- The District is gearing up for full 5 days for next year, so Principal Sunderman is asking staff to plan field trips.
