- What is LSDMC?
 - o approves school budget (more for Title I schools) and guides the mission & vision/focus of the school
 - CPS required committee
 - o LSDMC select and recommends principal replacements
 - Every school is supposed to be a community learning center; have to have a relationship with a lead agency (ours is CRC) which has a resource coordinator as a position for the school
 - Currently in interviews for a resource coordinator
 - Serve 2 years as a parent rep (elected position at the end of the year)
 - Ashley Hammond and Lavonda Kirkland's position will expire EOY
 - o Ed was re-elected as the chair
- Home-a-rama is in Oakley this year (9/27 is 50% off discount and 9/29 is HPS discount day)
- Signing construction on Hyde Park Square late September
- Ongoing talks about development: council voted to withdrawal zoning approval so it will not go to the ballot and the hotel is out basically starting back at square zero
- Xavier is asking for increased support for student teachers; conversations ongoing
- DEI Lisa Nolan is the chair still finalizing schedule for the years. Main goal is to make 2 more big events more inclusive (Mom Prom -> Eagle Prom and Daddy Daughter Dance will be the Valentine's Dance). Badge clinic
